

Jennifer Sullivan is currently completing her student teaching practicum at Northern Arizona University. She plans to graduate in December 2020.

In her scholarship application essay, she writes:

Children need caring and responsive adults in their lives. I want all children to know the feeling of being heard and feeling important. I have spent my life's work ensuring the children I encounter have the opportunity to feel this way. I have had the privilege of meeting thousands of children and making lasting relationships with many of the families.

I have been a member of NAEYC since I received my first CDA over 10 years ago and have been a member of AzAEYC since moving to Arizona. I have relied on both of these resources when writing papers for school, quoting standards and policy, and creating lesson plans. I often refer to NAEYC and AzAEYC to ensure I am offering a developmentally appropriate curriculum to my students. When I finish school, my goal is to find a job that I can use my experience, knowledge, and degree to advocate for the early childhood field. I don't just want to make a difference today, I want to make a difference that can be felt for generations.
