Materials Budget Overview

Each participant of DAP ECHO, including directors, receive a materials budget of \$150 (per person), including tax but not shipping.

- 1. Must have attended all sessions or completed all make-up training.
- 2. Can be combined with another colleague or classroom for larger purchases.





Materials Budget Overview

Your budget can be spent on:

- Developmentally appropriate early learning materials, supplies, and books, for children in your classroom
- Professional resources such as books and publications or a membership to Treasures 4 Teachers





Materials Budget Overview

Your budget cannot be spent on:

- Developmentally inappropriate materials/supplies
- Professional development or training costs
- Anything that is not related to early learning materials for young children or professional resources for staff





Materials Budget Process

AzAEYC will order your materials on your behalf and ship them to your program address (typically labeled with your name as a participant). Ordering may take 2-3 business days, and shipping depends on the vendor.

We can order from nearly every vendor, but we do have a few suggested options we will share with you.



Materials Budget Process

You will submit the following information through a Google Form that our team will send you. You may have one or multiple submissions based on need (up to \$150 each).

- Your first and last name
- Your program name
- Full names of the materials (be descriptive)
- Vendor name(s)
- Prices per item
- Web address link(s)

- Allow for symbolic representation, literacy, the visual arts?







Tips for selecting your materials

- 1. Reflect on what the children enjoy doing (e.g., building, painting, dramatic play). Select materials that support their interests.
- 2. Consider materials that you don't already have or may be unable to get through your program or Quality First that can enhance your existing set of materials.
- 3. If there's something beyond your budget that could benefit multiple teachers at your site, collaborate together to combine your funds!
