#### RESOLUTION

## No. AP-25-062

### (Proclaiming April 5-11 as the Week of the Young Child)

- WHEREAS, the San Carlos Apache Tribe (the "Tribe") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to the provisions of Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984); and
- WHEREAS, the San Carlos Council ("Council") has the authority, among other things, to "represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, and to make decisions not inconsistent with or contrary to [the Tribe's] Constitution and Bylaws," to "administer charity," pursuant to Article V, Section 1(a) and (h) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the San Carlos Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, all of Arizona's children deserve quality early care and education environments, including members of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, access to quality, nurturing child care programs on the Reservation set a positive foundation for children's lifelong development during the critical years from birth to age five; and
- **WHEREAS,** supporting quality early learning and children's health programs on the Reservation is a smart investment that improves family well-being, strengthens communities, and grows our state's prosperity; and
- WHEREAS, First Things First, Arizona Association for the Education of Young Children, Southern Arizona Association for the Education of Young Children, and other community organization, in conjunction with the national Association for the Education of Young Children, are celebrating the 54th anniversary of the Week of the Young Child; and
- WHEREAS, the Council finds that these organizations are working to improve equitable early childhood opportunities that provide a strong start for children who are members of the Tribe; the childcare workforce, early childhood educators, and others who care for and teach young children deserve to be recognized and supported for their essential work; and public policies that support affordable, accessible quality child care for all young children benefit our families, communities, and the state's economy; and, as such, a proclamation in support of young children is in the best interest of the Tribe and our children.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the San Carlos Apache Tribe, that:

- 1. April 5-11 is hereby proclaimed as the Week of the Young Child, and for such purpose all citizens are encouraged to support and invest in early childhood education in our community.
- 2. All of the Tribe's Departments providing services to children are hereby directed to undertake significant and public activities in support of children.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Council of the San Carlos Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
